

One Week National workshop on Punjabi folk literature was organised by Government Degree College



The Department of Punjabi of Government Degree College Bishnah has organised a week long National Workshop from 15-20 November on the topic "Idiom Proverbs and Riddles of Punjabi Folk Literature: Exploring the Rich Tradition of Cultural Wisdom." This Week-long workshop is divided into two sessions. The morning session will discuss the theoretical aspects of the idiom, proverbs and riddles by Dr Pawan Tibba, Punjabi folklore researcher and lecturer, Northern Regional Language Centre, Patiala. According to her, this workshop is designed to extend the scope of the curriculum of the undergraduate programmes of Jammu University.
